Our goals with you this summer:

Equitable Collaboration:

Learn to work in an integrated Intercultural team.

Global Health Experience:

Conduct a global health project from conception to implementation to publication.

Cultural Experience:

Live in a foreign country and experience the unique and beautiful culture of Uganda.

Fellowship Structure:

Before Departure:

Partner with Ugandan and American students to create a project based on common interests.

In Uganda:

Get to work! Weeks will consist of project implementation and weekends will include excursions to experience Uganda.

Return Home:

Analyze results and receive mentorship to publish findings (optional).

Program Tuition:

Program will cost **\$2579***. Many universities have grants to subsidize this cost.

Includes:

- project costs
- accommodation
- food including catering for dietary restrictions
- transport
- staff salary
